## Recommendations for moving forward:

1. Every content area agrees on at least one and no more than two competencies required of all courses in that area for immediate implementation. Third and fourth competencies may be designated for implementation at some point in the future. Knowing which competencies will be required in the future will make it easier to develop future courses.
2. Each of the 11 competencies is required in at least one content area. (There are 11 content areas and 11 competencies so if every group "owns" one then they are all covered.)
3. Require at least 3 student learning outcomes (bullets) per competency. Susan's note: "...you will get a more valuable picture of learning if you address the [entire] set."
