Food Assistance/SNAP Benefits

- Provides grocery purchase support
- Increases access to healthy nutritional food
- Improves school readiness
- Helps local communities and economies
- Helps food banks/pantries maximize their ability to more fully supplement SNAP benefits for food security
- Lowers Medicaid expenditures for the State



Why SNAP Matters



- SNAP provides individuals with an average of \$130 a month per person.
- Food insecure homes spend 32% more on healthcare costs
- In 2014, U.S. estimated health-related costs of food insecurity were \$160.7 billion



- > 74% of SNAP participants are in families with kids
 - Nationally figure is 68%
- 25% of SNAP participants are in families with elderly or disabled members
 - Nationally figure is more than 30%
- 58% of new SNAP applicants are on the program for less than one year
- Colorado currently serves approximately 60% of all program eligible


Financial Aid Exemption for Eligible Students

Comparison of the Percent of SNAP Applications Approved for Students










