• In the nation, more than 40% of all incoming freshmen into higher education required some level of remediation.


Remedial Education






Math Assessment, by Inst Type






Remediation by Sector
















FY2010 Remediation Rates, Ethnicity

Demographics - Non Traditional Students

- Defined 20 years or older
- Nontraditional students comprised 40% of the population but of those 35% required remediation.
- Like traditional students non-White students had higher remedial needs.
- Math- highest numbers of students 11%. 7% of non-traditional students need remediation in all three subjects.

At 2-year institutions, counts are degrees, i.e. a single student that received a certificate as well as an Associates is counted twice.

The Graduation Rate of transfers only includes degrees attained by transfers at Colorado institutions reporting to SURDS. Transfers to private schools that don't report to SURDS or out of state are not included.

For two-year transfers, the rate only includes those that attained an associate degree or certificate after transfer, at Colorado institutions reporting to SURDS.




