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INTRODUCTION

States across the nation are implementing strategies to increase the success of high school students and ensure they are college and career ready. One successful strategy is dual or concurrent enrollment, which provides high school students the opportunity to enroll in college courses. Colorado is emerging as a leader among states in the number of students participating in a dual enrollment program and the implementation of innovative programs. Studies have shown students who participate in concurrent enrollment programs are more likely to enroll in college, remain in college, and earn a credential. Colorado data show that students in concurrent enrollment programs are more likely to matriculate to college, have higher credit hour accumulation, higher grade point averages, and are more likely to be retained in college after the first year.

The data in this report provide a descriptive summary of concurrent enrollment in Colorado for the 2011-2012 academic year. Data in this report illustrate dramatic increases in the number of students participating in concurrent enrollment programs.

This report summarizes:

- 1. Data on the number of and names of local education providers¹ and institutions of higher education that have entered into cooperative agreements;
- 2. Number of public school students participating in concurrent enrollment;
- 3. Demographic information about students that participated in concurrent enrollment;
- 4. Data on the total number and percentage of students that failed to complete concurrent enrollment courses during the 2011-2012 school year;
- 5. College matriculation into public institutions of higher education in Colorado of a cohort of previously dual enrolled students; and
- 6. Outcomes analyses exploring the benefits of concurrent enrollment in regards to student success

In this report "Concurrent Enrollment" is the "simultaneous enrollment of a qualified student in a local education provider and in one or more postsecondary courses, which may include an academic or career and technical education course, at an institution of higher education" as detailed in 22-35-103 C.R.S. Other than the statewide summary (Tables 1 and 2), this report does not include data on PSEO, Fasttrack, or other concurrent programs not described in House Bill 09-1319 as these dual enrollment programs were phased out in the Summer of 2012 or are institution specific. Data were collected through the DHE Student Unit Record Data System (SURDS) and CDE report requirements for the 2011-2012 academic year.

The Colorado Department of Higher Education (DHE) and the Colorado Department of Education (CDE) are required by statute to prepare a report on students taking concurrent

enrollment² in Colorado's public education system each year. This report is submitted to the Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives pursuant to 22-35-112 C.RS.³

Highlights of this report include the following:

- Approximately 24,000 students participate in dual enrollment programs. This is approximately 19 percent of all 11th and 12th graders in public high schools in Colorado.
- Overall, participation in dual enrollment programs increased by 15.5 percent between 2010-2011 and 2011-2012.
- Eighteen public colleges and 304 local education providers have 395 Concurrent Enrollment cooperative agreements.
- Slightly more females participate in concurrent enrollment program compared to males and an increasing number of minority students are participating in concurrent enrollment programs.
- Participation in basic skills concurrent enrollment courses is approximately five percent of the Concurrent Enrollment total.
- Students who participated in concurrent enrollment programs in high school had higher grade point averages, higher retention rates, and higher credit hour accumulation in college.

COMPREHENSIVE SUMMARY OF DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAMS

Table 1, Table 2 and Figure 1 provide a summary of the different dual enrollment programs in the state during the 2010-2011 and 2011-2012 academic years. The phasing out of Fasttrack and PSEO in the summer of 2012 is reflected in the decreased numbers. During the academic year 2011-2012, 24,000 high school students participated in a dual enrollment program or 19 percent of all 11th and 12th graders. This number increased by more than 3,000 students since 2010-2011, a 15.5 percent increase in one year. The greatest number and highest area of growth of students was in the Concurrent Enrollment program. The ASCENT program and "Other" concurrent high school programs also experienced considerable growth in the 2011-2012 academic year. The "Other" category includes individually, institutionally designed dual enrollment programs, such as CU Succeed.




Table 2 provides enrollment in the various dual programs by institution of higher education. The two-year institutions that served the most students in the 2011-2012 academic year were the Community College of Aurora, with 2,772 students, followed by Arapahoe Community College, with 2,365. Of the four-year institutions offering concurrent enrollment programs, the University of Colorado Denver served 3,775 students primarily through their institutional developed dual enrollment program, followed by Colorado State University Pueblo, with slightly more than 1,000 students. For a complete concurrent enrollment summary by institution of higher education, please see Appendix B.

The balance of this report will summarize Concurrent Enrollment programs as described in House Bill 09-1319 and ASCENT where specified. That is, PSEO, Fasttracks, and "Other" dual enrollment programs will not be hereafter reported.

DATA ON CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT PROGRAMS

1. Partnership Summary

The remainder of the report summarizes the Concurrent Enrollment programs and ASCENT where specified. An increased number of local education providers and higher education institutions adopted the Concurrent Enrollment model for the 2011-2012 academic year. Table 3 lists the number of local education providers and high schools that entered into cooperative agreements, by institution of higher education. In 2011-2012, 18 institutions of higher education and 304 high schools participated in cooperative agreements using the Concurrent Enrollment model per 22-25-104 C.R.S, which represents 64.3 percent of high schools in Colorado. The total number of participating institutions of higher education increased by six institutions and the number of cooperative agreements increased by 152 to 395, when compared with the 2010-2011 academic year.

2. Enrollment, Demographics, and Academic Success

For the 2011-2012 academic year, participation in Concurrent Enrollment increased by 4,656 students compared to the previous year. This increase can be attributed to the increase in participation by institutions of higher education and local education providers. Arapahoe Community College had the largest increase of students enrolled in the concurrent enrollment program, with more than 2,300 students in 2011-2012. Colorado Mesa University also saw a large increase of more than 600 students. Table 4 details the unduplicated student count for participating institutions of higher education. See *Appendix A* for an unduplicated count of students by institution.

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Accelerating Students through Concurrent ENrollmenT (ASCENT): The ASCENT program was in its second year during the 2011-2012 academic year. Forty-five local education providers, an additional 42 from the 2010-11 year, participated in this program with a total enrollment of 129 students. Table 6 provides a list of the districts that participated in the ASCENT program.

Demographics: Table 7 provides a total headcount of Concurrent Enrollment participants by ethnicity, for the 2010-2011 and 2011-2012 academic years. Participation in Concurrent Enrollment by minority students experienced tremendous growth for the 2011-2012 academic year.

In the 2011-12 academic year, Native American/Alaska Native students had the greatest percent change at a 98.1 percent increase in participation in concurrent enrollment programs. Asian students had the second largest percent increase in concurrent enrollment. (Headcount enrollments, by ethnicity, for each participating higher education institution are available in Appendix B.)

Table 8 shows a headcount of concurrent enrollment participation by gender. Slightly more females participate in concurrent enrollment than males for the past two academic years. This is consistent with higher college matriculation rates for females compared to males. Males and females also saw similar growth in participation from 2010-11 to 2011-12.

Academic Success: Table 9 details the number of credit hours attempted and the total hours passed for Concurrent Enrollment by institution of higher education. The average number of hours attempted by all participating concurrent enrollment students was 5.3 with an average of 4.6 hours passed. The majority (78 percent) of students passed all of their Concurrent Enrollment courses (see Figure 2 below).



Remedial Courses: Table 10 details student participation in basic skills Concurrent Enrollment courses by institution of higher education. Of the Concurrently Enrolled students, 721 out of the 13,590 (5.3percent) enrolled in basic skills courses. Between 2010-2011 and 2011-2012, enrollment in basic skills Concurrent Enrollment courses saw a 39.2 percent increase. The largest such enrollments were at the Community College of Denver and the Community College of Aurora. Utilizing dual enrollment for remedial courses is a recognized strategy to help students successfully complete developmental education in a timely manner and prior to college matriculation.

Postsecondary Credentials: Table 11 displays the number and type of credentials earned by students participating in the Concurrent Enrollment or ASCENT programs during the 2011-2012 academic year and attending a public institution in Colorado. Of the approximately 13,000 students participating, 483 have already earned some type of credential. A majority of the credentials are certificates as the other degrees require the students being enrolled for longer periods of time. The types and number of credentials are detailed in Table 11.

DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAMS OUTCOMES

The purpose of this section is to investigate the effect participation in dual enrollment programs had on the success of high school students once enrolled in college. In order to test the relationship between dual enrollment and matriculation, credit hour accumulation, and persistence, basic inferential tests of differences were used. For this purpose, the dataset was expanded to include three years of data comprised of the 2009, 2010, and 2011 public high school graduating cohort. Additionally, concurrent enrollment includes participation in any dual enrollment program offered in the state. More robust multivariate analyses will be performed in spring 2013.

a. Matriculation

Of the high school students participating in a dual enrollment program, on average, more than 85 percent enrolled in college the following fall after graduation. Among students who were <u>not</u> enrolled in a dual enrollment program, on average only 50 percent enrolled in college the next year (p<.001). The data suggest that students participating in a dual enrollment program are more likely to matriculate to a public college in Colorado than high school students not concurrently enrolled.

b. Credit Hour Accumulation

College students who participated in a dual enrollment program had higher earned cumulative credit hours, on average 33 credit hours, by the end of their first year of

college compared to approximately 18 credit hours earned for students who were not dually enrolled in high school (p<.001). Although this finding may not be surprising since students begin earning college credits in high school, the accumulation of higher credit hours has been linked to retention and successful degree attainment.

c. First Year Grade Point Average

Matriculated college students who had participated in a dual enrollment program in high school have, on average, higher first year GPAs (2.66) compared to students who were not dually enrolled (1.89). This difference is statistically significant (p<.001). Higher GPAs have also been shown to be a positive predictor of postsecondary success and degree attainment.

d. Retention

Examining the 2009 and 2010 high school graduates who have enrolled in college, those students who participated in a dual enrollment program have higher first year retention rates at 78percent, on average, compared to a retention rate of 58percent for students who were not concurrently enrolled (p<.001). First year persistence has been shown to be a positive predictor of degree attainment.

Matriculation, credit hour accumulation, grade point average, and first year retention are important steps on the way to earning a credential. The findings suggest that participation in dual enrollment programs has a statistically significant and positive influence on academic progress and success. The widespread efforts to offer dual enrollment programs to students across the state should have long term benefits in helping our students achieve their goals and appears to be a robust strategy for improving participation and success in college.
