CAP4K Town Hall Meeting in Limon Thursday, March 26 on Postsecondary and Workforce Readiness

The Colorado Department of Education, the Colorado Department of Higher Education and the Lincoln County Economic Development Corporation will host a town hall meeting in Limon on Thursday, March 26, as part of the ongoing effort to establish a description of "postsecondary and workforce readiness."

The meeting will be held from 5—7 p.m. at the Limon Community Building, 477 D Ave.

Educators, students, parents, business and community members and interested citizens are invited to the meeting, which will be facilitated by Commissioner of Education Dwight D. Jones.

The gathering in Limon will be the sixth of 12 statewide meetings planned to solicit a broad spectrum of community thinking. The work was launched by Senate Bill 08-212, the "Preschool to Postsecondary Education Alignment Act" also known as the Colorado Achievement Plan for Kids (CAP4K).

Tuesday, March 24

On Tuesday, March 24 a similar discussion will be held at Denver Metro Chamber of Commerce, 1445 Market St., from 3—5 p.m. This meeting is by invitation only.

The town hall forums will focus on such questions as:

- What do students need to be workforce ready?
- What do students need to be postsecondary ready?
- Are there special considerations for the workforce or higher education in your region of the state?

S.B. 08-212 requires that the Colorado State Board of Education and the Colorado Commission on Higher Education adopt a description of "postsecondary and workforce readiness" by Dec. 15, 2009.

Further, S.B. 08-212 seeks to establish a seamless pathway from preschool into college or the workplace. Essential to that pathway is an understanding of what it means to be ready for education or the workforce after high school and a plan to ensure that students take the necessary courses and master the content to do so.

The description of postsecondary and workforce readiness will provide a bookend to a description of "school readiness," which was adopted by the Colorado State Board of Education in December, 2008.

These descriptions of school readiness and postsecondary and workforce readiness will guide the final selection of new statewide model content standards, which are being revised for the first time since they were adopted 13 years ago.

Similar community meetings are scheduled from 5 to 7 p.m. for Wednesday, April 15 in Alamosa; Thursday, April 16 in Pueblo; Wednesday, April 22, in Sterling; Tuesday, May 5 in Steamboat Springs; Thursday, May 14, in Glenwood Springs; and Tuesday, May 19, in Durango. Precise locations are to be announced.
