

**\*University of Colorado System Tuition Setting Authority Request**

Under the tuition setting authority granted by Senate Bill 10-003, the University of Colorado System (CU System) is requesting the following tuition setting authority:

1. Under the current FY 2011-12 allocation proposal, the CU System is allocated about \$158.5 million and is not requesting the authority to increase resident undergraduate tuition above the 9 percent under Senate Bill 10-003.
2. If FY 2011-12 state funding for the CU System is between \$142.8 million and 158.5 million, the CU System is requesting authority to raise resident undergraduate tuition rates up to 9.5 percent in FY 2011-12.
3. The CU System is not requesting the authority to increase resident undergraduate tuition above the 9 percent under Senate Bill 10-003 in FY 2012-13 through FY 2015-16.

**CCHE FAP Review Subcommittee Recommendation:** Approve the tuition authority requested by the CU System for FY 2011-12 through FY 2012-13. As part of this approval, the CU System will provide to the commission an update on the strategies adopted by the CU Board of Regents to implement the tuition increase in FY 2011-12 and FY 2012-13 and regular updates on the following:

1. Providing data (as agreed to by the Department and the CU System) on the enrollment, retention, and completion of low and middle income students and underserved student populations at the various campuses within the CU System.
2. Other current information (as available) relevant to measuring the success of low and middle income students and underserved student populations at the various campuses within the CU System.

**\*Tuition authority approved under the provisions of Senate Bill 10-003 is not tuition rate setting for FY 2011-12. Final FY 2011-12 tuition rates and policy will be set by the CU Board of Regents in the spring of 2011.**
