

Department of Higher Education Statement on ITT Tech Closing

With any school closure, the department's primary concern is the students and their education. We are pleased that a number of Colorado public and private institutions have expressed an interest in serving these students, and the department will facilitate and assist with such agreements when possible. We are also working proactively to facilitate additional educational options for students affected by the ITT closure.

The Department of Higher Education's role is to ensure that students are apprised of relevant information and their rights under the law. To that end, the department will assist students with questions about transfer, financial aid and related issues. Please note that the department cannot mandate institutions to enroll students or accept credits. Nor does the department have any jurisdiction over federal financial aid.

Next steps for former ITT students:

The department encourages students to consider each and every educational option and to contact potential institutions to discuss transfer of credits, financial aid, and enrollment details.

- **Loan discharge:** Some students may be eligible for discharge of their federal student aid; however, you may lose the credits you have earned if you have your loan discharged. Please see the U.S. Department of Education's [website](#) to ensure you understand the process.

Transfer Options

With any transfer, the receiving institution will determine which credits are eligible for transfer. To see if your credits may transfer, contact the institution you are considering attending.
