A. Consideration of Renewal of Certificate of Approval with Programs/Courses

1. New America College – Niagara - Denver

Program Specialist Esquibel brought to the Board's attention for consideration of renewal New America College – Niagara, Denver and for review and consideration one new stand alone course: Business English. School representatives were present. The school satisfied the Board's inquiry. Upon determining that the school is in compliance with the required surety level in the amount of \$26,004.38; that the school submitted a certificate of deposit in the amount of \$45,000; and that the school can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and in compliance with the Division's minimum requirements, Ms. Malay moved that the Standard Certificate of Approval be granted to New America College – Niagara, 925 S. Niagara Street, Suite 140, Denver, CO 80224 for the period beginning July 1, 2014 and ending June 30, 2017, and the above-referenced course be approved effective January 28, 2014. The combined motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

School representatives were present. Based upon the Board having determined that the above-referenced programs and courses for The Pilates Center, 5500 Flatiron Parkway, Suite 110, Boulder, CO 80301 can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and with the Division's minimum requirements, Ms. Malay moved to approve the above-referenced programs and courses effective January 28, 2014. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

2. Accounting & Business School of the Rockies – Greenwood Village

Program Specialist Belisle brought to the Board's attention for review and consideration two new stand alone courses: (1) QuickBooks Complete; and (2) AIPB Prep Course, proposed by Accounting & Business School of the Rockies, Greenwood Village. School representatives

were present. Based upon the Board having determined that the above-referenced courses for Accounting & Business School of the Rockies, 5420 S. Based upon the Board having determined that the above-referenced program for Colorado Media School, 404 Upham Street, Lakewood, CO 80226 can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and with the Division's minimum requirements, Mr. Semakula moved to approve the above-referenced program effective January 28, 2014. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

7. Tresses Studio – Glenwood Springs

Program Specialist Belisle brought to the Board's attention for review and consideration one new program, Manicurist, proposed by Tresses Studio, Glenwood Springs. No school representative was present. The school satisfied the Board's inquiry. Based upon the Board having determined that the above-referenced program for Tresses Studio, 1317 Grand Avenue, #117, Glenwood Springs, CO 81601 can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and with the Division's minimum requirements, Ms. Malay moved to approve the above-referenced program effective January 28, 2014. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

8. Love Christian Fellowship - Denver

A School representative was present. Based upon the Board having determined that the above-referenced courses for Massage School of Colorado, 7100 W 120 Avenue, Broomfield, CO 80020 can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and with the Division's minimum requirements, Ms. Malay moved to approve the courses effective January 28, 2014. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

1. The Denver School of Hypnotherapy - Aurora

Program Specialist Belisle brought to the Board's attention for consideration of renewal The Denver School of Hypnotherapy, Aurora. A school representative was present. The school satisfied the Board's inquiry. Upon determining that the school is in compliance with the required surety level in the amount of \$12,350; that the school submitted a bond in the amount of \$20,000; and that the school can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and in compliance with the Division's minimum requirements, Mr. Semakula moved that the Standard Certificate of Approval be granted to The Denver School of Hypnotherapy, 2620 S. Parker Road, Suite 370, Aurora, CO 80014, for the period beginning July 1, 2014 and ending June 30, 2017. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

2. Barnett Bicycle Institute – Colorado Springs

Program Specialist Belisle brought to the Board's attention for consideration of renewal Barnett Bicycle Institute, Colorado Springs. School representatives were present. The school satisfied the Board's inquiry. Upon determining that the school is in compliance with the required surety level in the amount of \$20,150; that the school submitted a bond in the amount of \$22,000; and that the school can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and in compliance with the Division's minimum requirements, Mr. Steele moved that the Standard Certificate of Approval be granted to Barnett Bicycle Institute, 2725 Ore Mill Road #23, Colorado Springs, CO 80904, for the period beginning July 1, 2014 and ending June 30, 2017. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

3. McKinley College – Fort Collins

Program Specialist Belisle brought to the Board's attention for consideration of renewal McKinley College, Fort Collins. School representatives were present. The school satisfied the Board's inquiry. Upon determining that the school is in compliance with the required surety level in the amount of \$41,528; that the school submitted a bond in the amount of \$50,000; and that the school can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and in compliance with the Division's minimum requirements, Mr. Steele moved that the Standard Certificate of Approval be granted to McKinley College, 2001 Lowe Street, Fort Collins, CO 80525, for the period beginning July 1, 2014 and ending June 30, 2017. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

5. Colorado School of Dental Assisting – Denver & Fort Collins

It was the will of the Board to consider the renewals for both locations as one combined matter.

Program Specialist Belisle brought to the Board's attention for consideration of renewal for both locations for Colorado School of Dental Assisting, Denver and Fort Collins. A School representative was present. The schools at both locations satisfied the Board's inquiry. Upon determining that the schools are in compliance with the required surety level in the amount of \$23,340; that the schools submitted a bond in the amount of \$50,000; (umbrella bond for Denver and Fort Collins); and that the schools can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and in compliance with the Division's minimum requirements, Mr. Semakula moved that the Standard Certificate of Approval be granted to both locations Colorado School of Dental Assisting, 2660 S. Monaco Parkway, Denver, CO 80222, and Colorado School of Dental Assisting, 1337 Riverside Avenue, #1, Fort Collins, CO 80524 for the period beginning July 1, 2014 and ending June 30, 2017. The combined motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

6. Mr. K's Floral Design School of Denver - Littleton

Program Specialist Belisle brought to the Board's attention for consideration of renewal Mr. K's Floral Design School of Denver, Littleton. No school representative was present. Upon determining that the school is in compliance with the required surety level in the amount of \$5,000; that the school submitted a certificate of deposit in the amount of \$5,275.70; and that the school can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and in compliance with the Division's minimum requirements, Mr. Steele moved that the Standard Certificate of Approval be granted to Mr. K's Floral Design School of Denver, 8555 W. Belleview Avenue, Littleton, CO 80123, for the period beginning July 1, 2014 and ending June 30, 2017. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

D. Consideration of Approval of Provisional Certificate of Approval

1. The Giving Touch, LLC – Grand Junction

Program Specialist Belisle brought to the Board's attention for consideration, The Giving Touch, LLC, Grand Junction, a new school with one proposed program: Massage Therapy 500 Hours. A school representative was present. The school satisfied the Board's inquiry. Upon determining that the school is in compliance with the required surety level in the amount of \$25,000; that the school submitted a bond in the amount of \$30,000; and that the school can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and in compliance with the Division's minimum requirements, Mr. Semakula in a combined motion moved that a Provisional Certificate of Approval be granted to The Giving Touch, LLC, 3154 Lakeside Drive, Suite 103, Grand Junction, CO 81506 for the period beginning January 28, 2014, ending June 30, 2015, and that the program before the Board be approved. The combined motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

2. Northern Colorado School of Real Estate - Loveland

Program Specialist Belisle brought to the Board's attention for consideration, NoCo School of Real Estate, Loveland, a new school with one proposed program: Real Estate Pre-Licensing. A school representative was present. The school satisfied the Board's inquiry. Upon determining that the school is in compliance with the required surety level in the amount of \$10,000; that the school submitted a bond in the amount of \$10,000; and that the school can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and in compliance with the Division's minimum requirements, Ms. Malay in a combined motion moved that a Provisional Certificate of Approval be granted to NoCo School of Real Estate, 6028 Stallion Drive, Loveland, CO 80538 for the period beginning January 28, 2014, ending June 30, 2015, and that the program before the Board be approved. The combined motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

3. Colorado School of Acting – Centennial

Program Specialist Esquibel brought to the Board's attention for consideration, Colorado School of Acting, Centennial, a new school with six proposed programs, and three new stand-alone courses. The courses are: (1) Summer Film Camp; (2) Voice Over Intensive; and (3) LA Trip. School representatives were present. The school satisfied the Board's inquiry. Upon determining that the school is in compliance with the required surety level in the amount of \$8,280; that the school submitted a bond in the amount of \$10,000; and that the school can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and in compliance with the

Division's minimum requirements, Ms. Malay in a combined motion moved that a Provisional Certificate of Approval be granted to Colorado School of Acting, 5730 E. Otero Avenue, Suite 600, Centennial, CO 80112 for the period beginning January 28, 2014, ending June 30, 2015, and that the programs and stand-alone courses before the Board be approved. The combined motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

E. Consideration of Change of Ownership

1. Living Arts Massage and Bodywork School (LAMBS) - Westminster

Program Specialist Esquibel brought to the Board's attention for consideration application for a change of ownership for Living Arts Massage and Bodywork School (LAMB), Westminster. School representatives were present. The school satisfied the Board's inquiry. Upon determining that the school is in compliance with the required minimum surety level in the amount of \$5,000; that the school submitted a certificate of deposit in the amount of \$5,000; and that Living Arts Massage and Bodywork School (LAMBS), 7188 Lowell Blvd, Westminster, CO 80030 can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and in compliance with the Division's minimum requirements, Mr. Steele moved that the change of ownership be granted for the period beginning January 28, 2014 and ending June 30, 2016. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

F. Consideration of Approval of Out of State School

1. Appraisal Institute – Chicago, IL

Program Supervisor Belisle brought to the Board's attention for consideration an application for one out-of-state school Appraisal Institute, Chicago, IL. The Board after determining that the out-of-state school meets the minimum requirements as set forth in 12-59-111(2), C.R.S.; that the school's bond be set in the amount of the statutory minimum of \$50,000; that the out-of-state school demonstrate compliance with the bond requirements pursuant to 12-59-115(8), C.R.S.; and that it can be reasonably maintained in compliance with the minimum standards as prescribed by the Private Occupational Education Act of 1981, as amended, and with the minimum requirements of the Division, Mr. Steele motioned that the out-of-state school, Appraisal Institute, 200 w. Madison Street, Suite 1500, Chicago, IL 60606, be granted the Standard Certificate of Approval for the period beginning January 28, 2014 and ending June 30, 2014. The motion was seconded and unanimously passed.

G. Notification of School Closings (no action required)

As an informational item only the Director reported the closing of one school: iPro Institute. Staff confirmed student completed their training and records and certificates of approval have been submitted to the Division.
