WHEREAS, The report provides practical improvement strategies to guide ongoing activities and establish measures of success and accountability structures to promote enrollment, persistence, and completion against equity gaps.

WHEREAS, Leadership is an essential pillar of Colorado's equity work, and the higher education community must continue to stress the importance of equity.

WHEREAS, We must keep a focus on equity and set an example for others to follow.
