Curriculum committees should be provided with this text and directed to evaluate whether courses in this content category meet these requirements before they are approved by the institution.

<u>Additional Requirements for Designating a Social & Behavioral Science Course as GT Pathways:</u>

A course in the Social & Behavioral Sciences must show evidence of significant high impact educational practices such as writing, collaborative learning, immersive learning, community/civic engagement, or research. Assigned writing, for instance, need not be limited to polished paper writing but might include low-stakes write-to-learn or write-to-engage for purposes of enhanced learning. Research suggests that





students learn and retain more when they write about what they are learning.¹ Additionally, students can learn a great deal about content through revision processes associated with writing that focus on responding to a peer or instructor's advice and revising to demonstrate their growing understanding of a subject.²

Section II: Competencies & Student Learning Outcomes for GT-SS1

The following Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs) for the required GT-SS1 competencies, <u>Critical Thinking</u> and <u>Civic Engagement</u>, shall be either: 1) copied and pasted verbatim into each instructor's syllabus, <u>OR</u> 2) mapped to the institution's own competencies and SLOs in each instructor's syllabus.

Critical Thinking:

- 1. Explain an Issue (required for GT-SS1)
 - a. Use information to describe a problem or issue and/or articulate a question related to the topic.
- 2. Utilize Context (required for GT-SS1)
 - a. Evaluate the relevance of context when presenting a position.
 - b. Identify assumptions.
 - c. Analyze one's own and other's assumptions.
- Understand Implications and Make Conclusions (required for GT-SS1)
 - a. Establish a conclusion that is tied to the range of information presented.
 - b. Reflect on implications and consequences of stated conclusion.

Civic Engagement:

- 1. Civic Knowledge (required for GT-SS1)
 - a. Connect disciplinary knowledge to civic engagement through one's own participation in civic life, politics, and/or government.
