A new Colorado Mountain College (CMC) Application for Admission is required from all applicants, including current or past CMC students, to provide current contact and residency information. 2. Applicants must be a graduate from an accredited AAS/ADN or Diploma Nursing Program. 3. Applicants must include a copy of current and unencumbered RN license from the State of Colorado. 4. Applicants MUST have a current American Heart Association CPR Certification and provide a copy of the CPR Certification. 5. If an applicant applies more than 3 years after receiving the associate degree in nursing, a minimum of 1000 hours of nursing work experience is required within the last three years (verified by the employer). 6. Applicants must hold a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale. 7. Applicants must submit an official transcript(s) for college credits completed. A CMC Application for Admission must be completed prior to having transcripts sent in. Applicants can fill out a CMC Application for Admission at any CMC site at the Registration Office. Remember to make a copy of the CMC Application for Admission, since you will also need a copy for your RN to BSN Nursing Application. For schools attended outside of Colorado, proof of NLN or CCNE nursing accreditation for the school where your associate degree in nursing was received is required. Proof of accreditation must cover through the date that you graduated. A total of at least sixty (60) semester or ninety (90) quarter hours of approved transferable non-nursing prerequisite course work. (This requirement has usually been met upon completion of your previous coursework). Transfer Credit for Nursing courses completed as part of the AAS in nursing degree = 30 Minimum credits required for BSN = 120. Recommended overall GPA is 3.00 or better.
