(E) COF Affidavit. Beginning in Fall 2013, this code is for identifying students completing a COF Affidavit for the enrollment period. (I) American Indian Residency SB 21-029 (C.R.S. 23-7-112)— Beginning in AY 21-22, grants resident tuition to American Indian students who are registered members of a federally recognized American Indian tribe with historic ties to Colorado (as designated by the Colorado Commission of Indian Affairs).
