


(F) Veterans Choice/Isakson and Roe Act benefit recipient. Veterans Choice Act Section 702; beginning in Fall 2015, this federal legislation requires that state institutions of higher education charge resident tuition rates to veterans or their dependents, if applicable, who are receiving benefits under the Post 9/11 GI Bill or Montgomery GI Bill and meet the criteria spelled out in the Veteran's Choice Act. Previously, under Veterans Choice Act, covered veterans had to enroll within 3 years of discharge to be eligible, that limitation was removed in 2020 with Isakson and Roe Act

(G) Persons Moving to Colorado for Employment. C.R.S. 23-7-111 grants in-state tuition classification to students whose parent or guardian moved to Colorado for the purpose of accepting a job in the state during the child's senior year of high school if: 1) the child moved with the parent that accepted the job and 2) the child graduated from a Colorado high school.
